Adhesive spread rates are determined, not by the adhesive or trowel notch, rather by the Carpet type, double or direct stick, substrate dryness and porosity and the climatic conditions.

Eg: FCA will bond jute backed carpets in warm dry conditions.

Tradex is needed to double Stick woven carpets in winter.
